DOUGLAS COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS Executive Board Meeting August 11, 2021 Discovery Garden Pavilion

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 10:02 AM. 13 were in attendance including President Julie Stanbery, VP Diana Woodward, OMGA Rep Kish Doyle, Past President Nancy Fuller and Secretary Bonnie Courter.

Agenda Approval: The agenda was approved as posted.

Minutes Approval: The minutes were approved as posted.

Agent's Report - Steve Renquist:

Steve received \$50 from the American Public Garden Association. Linda Harding, class of 2020 and who is now living in California, submitted our Discovery Garden to the association, and we received a check. We will send a thank you card to the association and to Linda.

There's been an explosion at commercial sites of stink bug damage in the last week, not the BMSB, but green stink bugs. Damage is found mostly in pears. A lot of farmers can't water due to low river levels. Levels are the lowest since September 2015.

<u>Fall Training Class</u>: Kish said there are 16 new students confirmed for the fall class so far. The maximum is 24. Chris Rusch also sent her names of those interested in the course from the Fair. There are a number of husband/wife teams. Steve said everyone scheduled as a lecturer has been verified. Julie suggested that instead of having a potluck at the Annex on the first day of class as we've done in the past, instead we could have a potluck for the students at the Pavilion on the last Thursday in September when we have our chapter meeting. They could come 1 hour before to do the Discovery Garden tour as well. We could get chicken for the potluck and everyone bring sides, salads and desserts.

OFFICER REPORTS

Membership - Kay Livermore: No report.

OMGA - Barbie Hamby: Kish Doyle reported that the virtual International Master Gardener Conference, based out of Virginia, will be held September 12-17. Here's the link to register for the event: www.internationalmastergardener.com.

Treasurer - Diane Smith-Lewsadder: Not present. Toni Rudolph gave her report. Financials were sent out. Anne Waddington's gift is in a separate account. The annual audit was performed on June 18 by Vicki McAlister, Karolyn Riecks and Dawnetta Loomis. Their report will be presented at the next chapter meeting.

Vice-President - Diana Woodward: The next LevelUp online class for August is on "Season Extension Techniques" to get more out of your garden come fall. She will send out the link.

This month's chapter meeting will be at the home of Dawnetta Loomis at Indian Bend. The potluck will be enhanced by pizzas baked in her own pizza oven. Attendees are encouraged to bring their favorite toppings for the pizzas as well as salads or desserts.

Past President - Nancy Fuller: There will be testing today at 11:00 for the National Alert Emergency System, so your phone might be sending you an alert.

President - Julie Stanbery: No report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Awards Team: "Awards" has been divided up into 3 responsibilities. Kay Livermore is now in charge of swinger bars. Ann Severson might take on the annual awards banquet, and another to take on the task of leading the nominations committee to select State MG of the Year and Behind the Scenes MG of the Year. Judy Huntley has reserved the Methodist Church for an October date for the banquet. In the event we are restricted again, we may have awards presentations at the HLC like last year.

Bake Sale - Janet Parkerson: Not present. Janet feels we should pass on the Bake Sale this year due to COVID's continued influence. We will bring it up at the chapter meeting for discussion.

Community Outreach - Leo Grass: Not present. No requests from the community.

Discovery Garden - Julie Stanbery: There are weedy patches to work on. Terrill Lowe embroidered plant names on fabric for the herb garden. Kathy Hart has been working on getting labels for plants in the Butterfly Garden. The Butterfly Garden heads recently had a meeting and it was proposed that the center garden could be a class project for the new class, concentrated on plants that would attract butterfly larvae to the garden. Kish has a trim-fold brochure that can be printed out for the dispenser. She will print some out, and send the file to Kathy Hart in a couple of weeks.

There's been lots of vandalism in the Rock Garden again. Steve suggested using a stinky spray on plants to discourage people from taking them.

We are still irrigating three times a week. The new tank has really worked well, providing river water for the dahlias and Children's Garden instead of using Umpqua Basin water.

Fair - Chris Rusch: The Fair was really fantastic! It was great to get out and tell folks about our program. We made lots of contacts, 320 in all. Some teams did better at outreach than others. We had some interest in our fall program and I have forwarded those names to Steve, Kish and Bonnie.

Fundraising - Nathan Baily: Not present. No report.

Greenhouse East - Ann Severson: Not present. Julie reported. There are sedums to give away. Help with weeding is needed. Christian Andino offered to help clean things up. It was suggested to use pre-emergent Preen in gravel areas to discourage weeds.

Greenhouse West - Joy Keeling: They are taking cuttings and dividing the plants bought from Peoria Gardens. They could use more help. They also need a covering in the work area to offer more shade. Solutions will be explored.

Hallmark - Linda Thames: Not present. Kish reported that Terry Hallmark is home now after losing his foot to amputation from a car accident. He now has an artificial limb and is doing physical therapy at home. Marla had a broken wrist.

Newsletter - Bonnie Courter: The September Newsletter will be like our normal January Newsletter, introducing Board members and chairpersons to the incoming class, so be thinking what you would want to write. Articles will be due August 28. Emeritus members should get the Newsletter for free.

Plant Clinic - Chris Rusch: Our Plant Clinic is open!! Things are a bit slow as we work to rebuild our program. The OSU Master Gardener Plant Clinic is an outreach opportunity to help our community plan their summer gardens and landscapes by answering a wide range of questions. This includes diagnosing plant problems and identifying insects. Our hours are 1-4, Monday through Friday.

If you want to work at the Plant Clinic, send Chris an email. We are accepting volunteers for the Monday through Thursday shifts 1-4 PM.

Publicity - Cheryl Caplan: Not present. No report.

Spring Into Gardening - Chris Rusch: Spring Into Gardening is still in my radar. I will be working with the front office to set a date and arrange the venue.

Victory Garden - Carolyn Ruzicka: Not present. Harvesting is on Mondays and Thursdays.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS:

<u>Use of Funds:</u> Julie began the discussion of how we should make good use of Anne Waddington's generous donation. We want to make it a legacy, not just a windfall.

Looking to the near future, we will need something to secure us as a chapter without an agent for possibly two years. The yearly training class is essential to provide the chapter with new volunteers, so Julie proposed we consider hiring someone to be a program director, not through OSU, to lead us through another fall class in 2022. Kish is willing to help coordinate that class. Steve says the challenge is finding people who can teach and who also have a good background in horticulture.

We also could put some funds towards improving our facility at HLC. We may need to have our own water meter installed if Helleck Hall should be taken over by the County. There's a new Parks Director, so this could change things.

We should have a committee to come up with ideas, calling it "The Waddington Fund Committee". Julie will put out an email asking for volunteers to be on the committee.

Nancy Fuller suggested we put maybe half of it into investment fund so it makes more money.

Toni said we need to revise the budget this fall as financial restrictions have been lifted. Our fundraising should continue to support our gardens.

Also we will plan to create a patio with a nice bench as a memorial to Anne. A good location would be near the perennial border and the Rock Garden. Sharon Hopkins volunteered to take that on.
