DOUGLAS COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS Executive Board Meeting June 14, 2023

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 10:02. There were 15 in attendance, including President Julie Stanbery, Past President Nancy Fuller, Vice-President Diana Woodward, Treasurer Dawnetta Loomis, OMGA Rep Barbie Hamby, and Secretary Bonnie Courter.

Agenda Approval: Victory Garden was added.

Minutes Approval: The minutes were approved as posted.

OFFICER REPORTS

Past President - Nancy Fuller: She saw Ann Waddington's memorial bench and found it very lovely and peaceful.

Membership - Kay Livermore: Not present - no report.

OMGA - Barbie Hamby: OMGA 2nd Quarter Meeting Report

The Oregon Master Gardener Association board held its 2nd quarter meeting Friday, June 2, 2023, via Zoom.

- Gail Langellotto gave her final report as OSU Extension MG Program Coordinator. She said there are "holes in the MG program" with positions not being filled and budgets being cut. She cited examples such as Benton and Lane counties with vacancies and Tillamook and Clatsop counties being understaffed. Josephine county's commissioners pulled money from their MG Extension budget. Other counties were facing similar situations.
- Advocacy group progress: Sherry Sheng reported on the progress made with our advocacy group to support SB 458, full funding for the OSU statewide, including OSU Extension. A few issues of concern: counties that had a staffing problem will likely see temporary measures go away at the end of the fiscal year on June 30. This means we need to continue advocacy with the OSU Extension Administration for results. Oregon legislation's current vision of budget is below continuing service level. This is bad news. We should continue to talk to MG's about advocacy because it is important that we build the capacity for future needs. We also need to continue to contact our legislatures regarding our funding.
- **Gardener's Pen Newsletter**: OMGA's quarterly publication is available to view at omga.org. The next issue will be published in September.
- Policies and Procedures revisions are being made and should be completed this summer.
- **Historical Records** are being updated on OMGA's website. If you have any photos from MG events, send them to Linda Coakley so they can be included.
- Search for MG Program Coordinator is underway. The interview panel consists of two MG's (one is Chris Rusch) and a staff member. There are three final candidates and MG's are invited to join via Zoom or in person for the final interviews on June 27, 28, or 29. Interviews will be held in the Benton County Extension Office conference room. More information to follow.
- Joy of Gardening conference is July 7-8. There are 23 speakers slated to share their wealth of gardening knowledge. Registration is open now. Your help is needed to get the word out. The conference is open to everyone, including friends, family and the community. Please

spread the word. To date, about 50 people have registered and OMGA needs about 100 to break even. Treat yourself to a 2-day immersion of gardening classes. Go deep with plant experts exploring native plants, raised bed gardening, growing root crops, peppers and tomatoes, garden pests, pruning fruit trees. Learn current science techniques for garden soil, pollinators, regenerative landscaping and more. You can receive 10 hours of recertification credit and network with other Master Gardeners from across the state!!

- OMGA grants will be awarded at the conference. The "Send-a-Friend" scholarship application deadline has been extended to June 30, and as of June 2, there were still nine \$100 grants left to award. If there is anyone in your chapter that needs financial assistance to attend the conference, please contact Eric Bosler at: ericbosler@homail.com.
- OMGA dues will remain at \$7 per member for 2024. Dues collected have greatly decreased since 2019, when more than \$19,000 was collected. In 2020, that number dropped to \$18,260. No dues were collected in 2021 due to COVID. In 2022, \$11,361 was collected and thus far, in 2023, only \$9,622 has been collected.
- Officers are needed to fill board positions for the upcoming year, including president-elect, president and secretary. Please consider being on the board.

Treasurer - Dawnetta Loomis:

Trash to Treasure Sale made \$5,410.03. She requested \$200 from BottleDrop. There was a \$150 donation by Peterson/Bowns for the Discovery Garden.

Vice-President - Diana Woodward: Next chapter/potluck meeting will be June 29th at Laura Corder's home. Parking available along Singing Waters Road on the right. Diana is putting together a field trip to Dorena Genetic Resource Center where they raise oak trees sometime in July.

President - Julie Stanbery:

- Toni said that the purchase was made for the Waddington investment with Charles Schwab.
- A new 4H leader, Kelly Simonson, starts today. We should invite her to come to our chapter meeting at the end of this month.
- Julie has been in contact with Steve Renquist by email. He responded to Josephine County cutting off further funding for their Extension services, saying it's sad to hear and wishing we had pushed back harder while he was still with OSU. He and Ceda are spending most of their time looking for real estate - they are currently renting a house near Clemson University.

MG Program Coordinator - Logan Bennett: Not present.

- Lenore Drake and Sharon Bordeaux are working with Logan on a community outreach and education series starting in July, on the third Thursdays during the summer. These will be MG taught classes, free to the public, on gardening topics.
- As of June 30, Logan is funded as full time Small Farms position for another year, but he hasn't heard yet if he can continue on as MG Coordinator.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Blue Bags - Dawn Shumack: Dawn has bags. There have been 12 bags turned in so far this month. She learned a trick to make it easier to open the door at the recycle place by making a laminated copy of the code so it's smooth and easier for the reader to recognize it. She will test it out and let us know.

Community Outreach - Cheryl Caplan:

Recent presentations:

- The 2nd graders' visit to the Discovery Garden on May 31 went wonderfully. 100 2nd graders and 25 adults. A big thank you to all the MG's who shared their love of gardens with them.
- Presentation on container gardening to a group of special needs adults was also fabulous. Dawn Shumack wrote up & delivered a great presentation to 25 people.
- Sad to say that the UCAN Healthy Families event supposedly on May 25 was a nonevent. Geoff Puryear showed up and no one was there!

Upcoming:

- Series of 8 Wednesday afternoon classes to the gardening group at the Boys & Girls Club of Umpqua Valley. More details will go out to our membership.
- June 16 meeting she is meeting with Erin Maidlow, director of the Umpqua Valley Farm to School project, to find out how other MG associations are cooperating with Farm to School groups. Their mission: Empowering youth with knowledge and skills to create a healthy, equitable, and just food system.
- Leo Grass and Dawn Shumack will present a talk on soft-bodied insects to the Secret Wine Society in Oakland the evening of Father's Day, June 18.

Request:

Cheryl Caplan & Dawn Shumack would like to know who has a program ready to share with a group along with information on any presentations you are giving as a Master Gardener. While there is a place to note the outreach on the back of your monthly timesheet, we also keep a spreadsheet of all the presentations to make the end-of-year reporting go more easily.

Some MG's have contributed materials from their own money. Julie Stanbery asked how can we help out with funds for supplies? Dawnetta said we will need to bring a request up to the chapter membership at the meeting to designate funds, and Cheryl & Dawn should determine how much they should need for the rest of the year.

Discovery Garden - Julie Stanbery:

The plaque came in from the Sign Factory for the Waddington Memorial, costing \$328. Only \$124 was budgeted. Fred Alley will need to buy a few more pavers as well. Dawnetta Loomis moved that the Board add another \$300 to the Waddington Memorial. Bonnie Courter seconded. The vote was unopposed.

The plumber repaired the break in the line for compost tea, but it's still dripping. Dawn will consider managing the worm bin, taking over for Nathan Baily. Dave Hopkins repaired the leak in the Umpqua Basin line. We put in 4 new irrigation heads in the Japanese garden and in the worm bin.

Fair Booth - Chris Rusch: Not present - her report:

It's coming up to **Douglas County Fair time!** The Douglas County Extension and our Master Gardeners will staff an outreach booth. Responsibilities include talking with the public about our program and answering gardening questions. We are looking for 2 volunteers per shift. Almost all mentors are in place. They've ordered new books, and are going through all the homework answer sheets so page references match up. Cards and flyers were made up for the Farmer's Market to hand out, and a post made on Facebook. They are calling people who were on the waiting list, will send out applications in July, and interview in August. They need to update our website's opening page to announce the upcoming Fall Class.
