DOUGLAS COUNTY MASTER GARDENERS Executive Board Meeting April 10, 2024

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 10:04. There were 16 in attendance including President Julie Stanbery, Past President Nancy Fuller, Vice-President Andrea Collins, OMGA Rep Patrice Sipos, Treasurer Dawnetta Loomis, Membership Kay Livermore, and Secretary Bonnie Courter.

Agenda Approval: Add "email calendars".

Minutes Approval: The minutes were approved as posted.

OFFICER REPORTS

Past President - Nancy Fuller: Someone broke the bird bath in the Rock Garden, so vandalism is still going on. Nancy learned that we can't post security camera photos on FaceBook or social media under the OSU or MG umbrella. But we could post them under personal social media, as long as it doesn't say anything about OSU or Master Gardeners. Logan said we can send evidence to the Sheriff's Office and they can post it on their social media. Discussion ensued. Signs saying, "This area is under surveillance", could be posted along with fake cameras, only first we need to make sure such signs are allowed by the County. Logan will contact the Sheriff's Office about the vandalism taking place and what we can do about it.

In preparation for the League of Women Voters Tour, the Rock Garden crew gave the big cedar tree a "hair cut" yesterday so the branches are not on the ground. We also need to limb up some fir tree branches that are growing into it. Julie said she will take care of it.

Membership - Kay Livermore: No report.

OMGA - Patrice Sipos:

They are still working on putting together the Joy of Gardening Conference. Registration will open April 15 hopefully. You can register for one day or all weekend.

OMGA offers several grants and awards to our chapters. The deadline for applications is May 15.

- Karl Carlson Memorial Fund serves to enhance and supplement the OSU home horticulture program. This can help fund your many projects tied to educating our community about sustainable gardening practices.
- The Marje Luce Search for Excellence Program recognizes outstanding work by chapters in community service, innovative projects, youth programs and much more.
- The Extension Educator Grant supplies funds to help OSU Extension agents and program assistants enhance their ability to educate the public.
- Send a Friend scholarships are used to provide financial assistance for one or more of a chapter's MG's to attend our annual Joy of Gardening Conference.
- The OMGA Longevity award is to honor and thank Oregon MG volunteers for 20, 30, 40 or more years.

It was discussed that perhaps we should apply for the Search for Excellence grant for our soil sifting and compost production at the HLC. Logan said he'd be willing to prepare a presentation at the Joy of Gardening conference for this award. Geoff Puryear said he could make a video to go with the presentation.

Next year we should consider applying for this grant when our Anne Waddington Memorial Educational Greenhouse is completed. It would be great to do a photo journal of the process throughout construction for this purpose.

Treasurer - Dawnetta Loomis:

- Dues were turned in to OMGA.
- Taxes were completed and sent off to OSU.
- Under "Plant Sale" in the financial report under "Vendors", lots of refunds were given out as there have been some cancellations.
- When we start paying for the educational greenhouse, we should pay using funds we have on hand first. Our CD matures in August, so we could take out the \$17,000 for that purpose.
- Correction under non-budgeted items regarding the tables for the vendors she sent out a check for tables - it just didn't show up on her report. She will update the financial copy and send it to Vicki to re-post.
- Larry Rich's name was not found on the credit list for Osborn Oil by mistake. Dawnetta will make sure his name is on their list.
- Bruce Gravens is getting two bids for everything for the educational greenhouse.

Vice-President - Andrea Collins: The next Continuing Education will be by Leo Grass at the April chapter meeting on watering. She is still working on May's CE. The June meeting will be at the home of Sarah Davis; July's at Anna Kircher's; August at Patrice Glasscock's.

President - Julie Stanbery: No report.

MG Program Coordinator - Logan Bennett:

- Educational Greenhouse We're still in holding mode, waiting for final approval by the County. We're probably 8 weeks out to get started, but we should be ready in the meantime.
- Photography consent forms for the public will be at every Pavilion series class. The form is only for those who don't want to be photographed.
- The lavender class, April 13, 2:30-4:00 is full registration is closed.
- Vermicomposting class, April 19, at the Glide Disposal Site (HealTerra), is free.
- Pavilion Series, April 18, is on up-potting plants, focusing on tomatoes and peppers. The one in May is on vegetable gardening.
- The Level Up series has started. Logan was impressed by yesterday's session on medicinal herbs. The next one is on growing vertical gardens.
- May 11 is a class on growing iris at Terringer Farm in Glide.
- For the May chapter meeting continuing education, Logan said he could present on garden pests or pesticides.
- He's giving a soils talk at a homeschool coop this Friday morning with Bonnie Courter.
- We got a surprise visit by Dr. Leslie Madsen, OSU MG Program Manager, who participated in the class and gave us some positive feedback.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Awards Nominations - Kay Livermore: Our committee met yesterday and finalized our nominations for MG of the Year and Behind the Scenes MG of the Year.

Black Apparel - Andrea Collins: Prints Charming said our order will be ready by mid-week. They will be given out at the April chapter meeting in time for the Plant Sale.

Blue Bags - Andrea Collins: She has blue bags to give out.

Community Outreach - Dawn Shumack: Not present - her report:

Discovery Garden - Julie Stanbery:

- The Farmers Market MG booth starts in June. Sylvia Andino would like someone to partner with her.
- The sifter broke and needs welding. Ed Barrett needs another \$300 to fix it. Andrea Collins moved that we allocate another \$300 to repair the sifter. Dawnetta Loomis seconded. The vote was unanimous, and the motion was approved.
- Mowing: We need someone to be a backup for mowing, using both the riding and the push mower. It's pretty much a weekly task this time of year.
- Sunday, the irrigation was hooked up. Eastside is now using river water. Umpqua Basin has been on. We hope to postpone watering as long as possible. We still have the big tanks to use. Shelby wants no water on her plot this year.
- Tools are still being left in gardens, and doors and gates left unlocked.
- Geoff Puryear has been leading a committee to add more labels to plants in the garden. They are presently taking inventory of all plants, garden by garden, to see what is needed for tagging and signage. They will upload the completed inventory to our website, giving a full plant list for each garden. Permanent plant labels are the goal, but for the upcoming tour, they will put together 15, 8-1/2 by 11 laminated signs to post throughout the Discovery Garden. Dawnetta has a laminating machine and can do those. They are looking for good metal tags, and will need about 400 "business card" sized tags. Eventually, they want to set up a universal tagging station in the green shed, so when plants are added, temporary tags can be put out. We could apply for a grant for this project like the Karl Carlson grant.

Greenhouse West - Carol Bolt: We've had lots of help. Planted the last of our seeds, cleaning plants, transplanting.

Greenhouse East - Ann Severson: Greenhouses look stunning - lots of helpers. We're on top of cleaning plants.

Hallmark - Dawn Shumack: Not present - her report:

Nomination Advisory Committee - Gloria Cettina: Our team is excited for nominations for President and Treasurer which will be presented at the April and May meetings, then voted on in person at the July meeting.

Newsletter - Bonnie Courter: No report.

Plant Clinic - Chris Rusch: Not present - her report:

First, I want to thank everyone who worked in March at our Plant Clinic! The Plant Clinic is one of our DCMG programs that reach out to our community to help people solve a wide range of gardening and landscape questions. We had over 60 calls, emails, and visitors.

Our training for the new class of 2023-24 is mostly completed. We are lucky to have a great team this year with Leo Grass, Gerry Crane, Doralee Hayden, Ken Parry, Diane Smith-Lewsadder, and Chris Rusch. The Plant Clinic is now open 5 days a week from 1-4. There are lots of openings. Stop by and put your name on the calendar!

Julie asked us to remember when working in the Plant Clinic, that we do not give out company or business names - the exception being bee swarms, as an example.

Chris Rusch added the following as well for the purpose of clarification:

- We have a list of certified arborists recommended by Alicia Christianson.
- We recommend soil testing at the DC Farmer's Coop when our facility is not operating also ALS laboratories.
- We have trappers on our contact list for nuisance animals.
- Compost, garden soil, etc., is often a request. We usually list all of the vendors available, DC Co-op, Mignola Farms, and others.
- Our contact list also includes: bat houses, native plant sources, and restoration for soil erosion.

Plant Sale - Joy Keeling:

We need more signups in Holding, Security, Transportation, and Checkers. We will have about 10 youth volunteers helping. We also need people to mentor for Raffle and a Publicity person for the sale.

Soils - Gloria Cettina: We've done some soil samples, and are ordering a few pieces of equipment. We hope to have a soft start in a few weeks, putting it on our website, then gradually on FaceBook. We are lowering the price for testing to \$7.50 for MG's and \$15 for the public. When we send out results, there will be a link to OSU soil testing websites. We're only testing for pH, and NPK, not soil texture.

Swinger Bars - Kay Livermore: No report.

Trash to Treasures Sale - Ann Severson: Still picking up donations. We will pass our goal of \$5200 easily.

Victory Garden - Carolyn Ruzicka: Not present - her report:

Work in the Victory Garden has been going well. To date all the bark chips have been put down on the pathways, the birdhouses have been cleaned for the birds to occupy. Peas, radishes, beets and carrots are up. Cabbages are doing well. The amazing work crew continues to pull weeds in-between our other duties.

OLD BUSINESS:

- League of Women Voters Garden Tour: We still need a MG facilitator for the tour June 8, 10-5.
 After the meeting, Kay Livermore volunteered to head that up. 2-3 MG's are needed to cover the morning and afternoon.
- AWMEG (Ann Waddington Memorial Educational Greenhouse) already covered.

NEW BUSINESS

- Bylaws & Policies Review: The Board met this morning to review bylaws and policies. No changes will be made except for Article VIII - Dissolution of Chapter. We formed a committee to recommend how to disperse our assets should we dissolve. The committee will be headed by Toni Rudolph with Gloria Cettina, Stefani Lavitt, Andrea Collins, and Laura Corder.
- Email Calendars Gloria Cettina: Logan, Patrice Glasscock and Gloria put together a draft
 monthly MG calendar they are proposing that will be posted on our website so MG's can
 quickly refer to upcoming activities. Hopefully this will decrease the need for so many member
 emails. A calendar could be sent out monthly that is posted on the website and possibly as an
 added link in the Newsletter. The idea was broadly approved, but details need to be worked
 out still.
