Grow a Seed - a bit of Wisdom from Jody Houghton



DCMG GENERAL MEETING

February 25, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President **Judy Huntley** at 10:06 AM. Approximately 55 members were in attendance.

President **Judy Huntley** asked if there were any changes to the Agenda. There were two additions.

<u>Agent Report:</u> **Judy Huntley** said that the Spring Into Gardening registration was at 8:30AM on Saturday February 27th. The graduation of the new class is on Tuesday, March 16th. at approximately 3:00PM so please plan to arrive about 2:45PM.

Officer Reports

<u>Membership:</u> Mik Carlson reported that there were 240 paid members. If cash was paid for the dues she has the receipts so please pick them up. The roster is ready and should be sent out around March 15th.

OMGA Representative: Carolyn Register is going to the March 6th quarterly OMGA meeting. The OMGA Endowment was discussed. Roger Sawyer presented a history of the OMGA Endowment. A brief meeting of Executive Board members and interested parties is to be held directly after the General meeting to discuss the endowment and advise Carolyn Register of what the DCMG Chapter thinks on the subject of that endowment's continuation. The DCMG will not submit a Search for Excellence award nomination to OMGA. The DCMG has a budget fund for scholarships to Mini-College. A request was made for silent auction items and door prizes for Mini-College.

<u>Treasurer:</u> **Karolyn Riecks** reported that the Overall Total funds are \$11,329.75. The Income and Expenses were reported.

<u>Vice President:</u> Judy Huntley reported that Mike McCarthy did not show up for the Continuing Education presentation so a panel of DCMG "experts" answered questions. **Elaine Moriarty** said that next month's Continuing Education program will be presented by Joe Lawrence on the subject of Terra Preta. She gave a description of Terra Preta.

<u>President:</u> Judy Huntley said that Carol Gray sent a letter resigning the Librarian position. The description of the Librarian's job will be in the Newsletter. She said there were two thank-you letters.

Committee Reports

<u>Community Outreach:</u> Leo Grass thanked everyone who signed up to work in the booth at the Home Show. The theme of the booth will be "Soils". **Patricia Gilbert** gave a presentation to the Umpqua Valley Garden Club.

<u>Plant Clinic/Farmers' Markets:</u> Judy Mercer reported that the Plant Clinic calendar is full for the month of March. If anyone wishes to be Librarian please contact her. She said **Yvonne Henderson** has done research to find out what was being done right and wrong in the Plant Clinic and there will be a report at next month's Chapter meeting. The Farmers' Market will open on April 17th.

<u>Discovery Garden:</u> Julie Stanbery said that the Donor Board was completed by Fred Sabin. It has three trees upon which donor's names will be attached. **Noel Groshong** will start the irrigation project in the Entry Garden as soon as the greenhouse heatbed and watering projects are finished. The next workday is March 3rd, 11:00- 2:00PM. The new class attendance has been good. The completion of the Tea House Patio will be the next project, after weeding. Regular Tuesday workdays will start on March 23rd, 9:00-12:00. The pavilion gutters have a problem. She will look into fixing the problem. She requested that anyone finding her pruners to please return them.

<u>Awards:</u> Betty Ison said there was a meeting after the Executive Board meeting earlier this month when the State awards were discussed.

<u>Publicity:</u> Theresa Sayler reported that she has sent out PSAs concerning the Trash to Treasures sale. Show and Tell/Good of the Order: Roger Sawyer had a pot with Mimosa tree starts to give away requesting they be prepared for the Plant Sale. He said starts from the Kiwi plants at the HLC should be done, but the plants need a male and a female. Philece Humphrey knows how to tell the sex of a kiwi plant and will work with whoever takes on this project. She said she has tried to propagate kiwi and had no success. Roger Sawyer had seeding trays and covers to give away. Julie Stanbery pointed out the curtains above the entrance to the Annex room. They are acoustic and help with temperature control. She said to be sure to thank John Punches for them. She read remarks/sayings about gardening from an Oregonian column. The Gossler Nursery in Springfield is having an open house on March 25-28th. They are a wholesale nursery and will be open at that time for retail sales. There was a question about the Butterfly Bush being on the State "Do Not Sell" list. The variety is "Davidii" and cannot be sold, nor should we have it to give away. If you have a butterfly Bush in your yard it must be deadheaded so it will not go to seed and be spread by animals.
